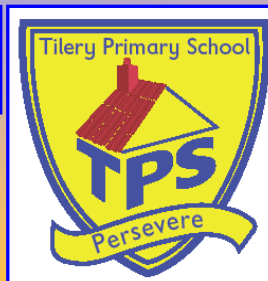

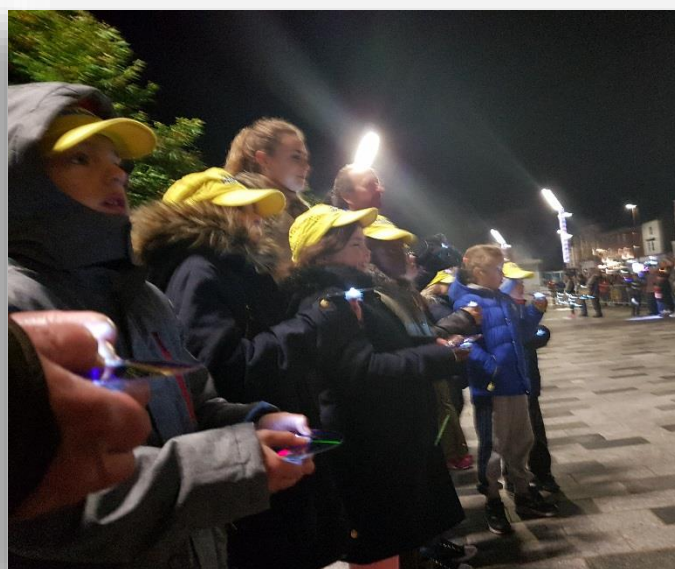
## FESTIVAL OF LIGHT
