TILERY HOUSE POINTS SYSTEM

Our new house system, which began in September, rewards children for the qualities and behaviour we value such as good manners, working hard and helping each other. The houses are named after inspirational people who have a connection with our region: Butterwick, Cook, Grey-Thompson and Stephenson. It has started well, with children collecting house points to earn themselves certificates and prizes as well as going towards the score for their house. The points for each house are added up at the end of every week and, from now on, the winning house will be awarded a golden rosette in assembly, which will be displayed on their house board for the following week.

House points are also added up at the end of each half-term and the houses will get a score of four, three, two or one based on their total. The end of term scores for each house will be counted at the end of the year to find the winning house. The winning house for the year will get a trophy, which will be displayed in school for the next school year, the captain and vice-captain will get a small trophy to keep and the children in that house will get a treat.

We will let you know the scores and the winning house in our weekly newsletter. This half term the winning house is Stephenson with 2379 house points. Well done to the children in Stephenson, after half-term you will have a movie afternoon with an ice-lolly treat.
